FROM THE DESK OF BRYAN EDWARDS



Greetings to all the members and families of Pipefitters Local Union 211. I hope everyone has had a safe and productive 2017 so far. I would like to invite all of the Local 211 members and their families to join us for an evening of fun, food, and fellowship along with hot dogs with all the trimmings and also a fireworks show at the Local 211 Union Hall located at 1301 W. 13th St., Deer Park, TX. 77536 starting at 6:00pm on the 4th of July. The fireworks are the courtesy of the City of Deer Park. If you are not traveling out of town this 4th of July please join us.

I would like to begin my report by saying that this year has so far been a very productive and positive year for Local 211. Local 211 has signed new contracts with 5 Contractors since January 1st, and that in itself is a huge accomplishment in such a short period of time. Since January 1st of this year Local 211 has signed these Contractors: 1) Dietel Company - HVAC Contractor; 2) Native Solutions - Commercial Contractor; 3) Kinetics - Purity Clean Room Contractor; 4) CYLX Corp. - Industrial Contractor; 5) Axis Mech. - Industrial Contractor. The greatest part of signing these Contractors is that 4 out of 5 of them have already employed numerous Local 211 members on different projects in our jurisdiction. The work in our jurisdiction is doing very well this year!

The commercial downtown work is doing well and we were fortunate to dispatch a lot of members to new school work that has recently begun in the past few weeks. The industrial work is doing better now than it has in the past several years with the Baytown Exxon site, and the Chevron Phillips site, and also, of course, our reliable South Texas Nuclear site which just completed a 150 hand Nuke outage. The Nuke outage was a huge success with approximately 150 people working 2 shifts, and this was completed on time without even a first aid for the Pipefitters! "Thank You" to those that participated in this successful Nuke outage.

All facets of our industry are busy at this time. Whether it is Commercial, HVAC, Instruments, Industrial, or Fab Shops, we seem to be sending hands out to all of these facets this year.

Pipefitters Local 211 has recently implemented instrumentation back into our Apprentice School curriculum. I have been in several meetings with many industrial plant managers, and also well known large contractors in the past year and the question has come up every time, "Do you have instrument techs, and if so how many?" I feel that this is a huge opportunity to get Local 211's foot in the door in these plants so this is why we have decided to go all out in training in this sector of work. This work thrives in Local 211 and Zone 195 (Beaumont). Zone 195 is already in several plants in Beaumont because they have some of the best Techs in the Country. Steve Parker of Zone 195 is the one responsible for this success in Beaumont, so he is helping Houston out with his curriculum so we can hopefully gain market share once again in this thriving industrial market. So far this year Local 211 has had work in all 3 zones of our jurisdiction whether it is Houston, Beaumont, or South Texas. All 3 zones are busy at the present time.

I would like the members to know that our new Union Hall and Training Center has been the focal point in several showcase meetings in the past few months. Our UA Rep has visited our facility 4 times in the past 5 months, which is very rare. The UA General President of late, along with so many UA Reps have also visited our facility. It is something we should all be proud of. UA Special Rep Corby Shelton made it mandatory that ALL Managers and Coordinators for Texas, Oklahoma, and New Mexico be at our facility for a meeting this past May 9th, and of course everyone showed up and absolutely loved our Union Hall and Apprentice School. Our new Kenneth Edwards Annex Building will have 50 welding booths in it along with so much more, and this brand new building should be ready for business by the end of June. I hope you all come by and check it out because it will also be something we can be proud of.


