Financial And Health & Welfare Update

The finances of Local Union 211 are doing great at this time and have been for the past 3 years. Of course a big reason for this is a spike in the man hours that have been worked in the past 3 years. Three years ago Local 211 worked an astonishing 4.2 million manhours followed by the next 2 years at 3.8 million manhours. This, with the combination of having our Apprentice School in the same building sharing the bills and expenses is the reason why our funds are doing so well.

The report of the health & welfare is unfortunately not so great. I remind you, this is a nationwide issue due to the rising cost of healthcare. Although the trustees have had to make some unpopular decisions to try to stop huge losses, it has only slowed the losses a bit. The trustees recently opened up bids on everything from healthcare providors to Administrators, to even our legal advisors. Although the current providors rates amazingly dropped due to the bid process, Local 211 is still seeing some substantial losses due to some high cost claims, cancer being one of them. I assure you that the trustees are meeting more now than ever before to try and fix this healthcare problem. It is the trustees fiduciary duty, by law, to make sure this health & welfare plan is sound. Pipefitter Local 211 still has one of the best insurance plans around and the trustees plan to keep it that way.





Brother and Local 211 President, John "Ace" Coody, will be leaving us due to a very well deserved retirement. It has been an honor and a priveledge to have worked with Brother Ace for the last 15 years here at Pipefitters Local Union 211.
